Our Leader-In Training Program is very selective. We have high expectations for participants. Please read and consider the following before submitting this application:

- We have reserved these slots for campers who truly show leadership potential and have a desire to excel in the camp setting. This is demonstrated through previous summer experience and performance (if applicable), the application, and a formal interview.
- All communications and forms should be the work of the LIT applicant.
- There are a limited number of spots in the LIT program.
- Submission of an application does not indicate an acceptance into the LIT program.
- Acceptance into the LIT program does not guarantee acceptance in future summer camps.
- LIT applicants must be ages 13-14. No exceptions.
- The number of applications accepted each week will vary dependent on the number of camper registrations.
- The \$75 weekly fee must be paid within 14 days of being notified application has been accepted. If selected week begins in less than 14 days, fee must be paid before the beginning of camp week.

Leader-In-Training Rules of Conduct

This document is a requirement for those selected into the LIT Program.

Leader-In-Training agrees to:

- Stay with assigned group at all times unless otherwise stated by the camp counselor. If on an assigned task, LIT shall not deviate from task for personal needs.
- Follow directions as given by program leaders.
- Maintain personal care and wear appropriate camp attire as described below. A LIT arriving at camp without appropriate attire will be asked to leave the site.
- Never be alone with children.
- Respect others in what you say and do. A LIT shall never use inappropriate language while in the vicinity of the site.
- Refrain from using cell phones during camp hours. LITs are discouraged from bringing a cell phone to camp. If the LIT must bring a cell phone, it must stay in the LIT's assigned locker in the vibrate or silent position. LITs found using a cell phone for any reason during camp hours will immediately forfeit their right to bring a cell phone. Confiscated cell phones will remain in the camp office until the end of the day, when the parent/guardian may pick up the phone. LITs needing to make an emergency phone call during the day will have access to a site phone under counselor/director supervision.
- Get to know campers' names as soon as possible.
- Never use physical punishment, restrain or force a child.
- Be of good character.
- Keep campers' information confidential.
- Take care of personal belongings and keep belongings out of campers' reach.
- Use equipment and supplies in a safe and appropriate manner.
- Teasing and bullying are not tolerated and are grounds for enrollment termination for campers and Leaders in Training. Observing bullying and not communicating it to a counselor is just as bad as doing the bullying yourself.
- Create a safe environment.
- Notify a counselor if a child is injured. This includes broken or lost teeth, bruises, and cuts. LITs are not permitted to administer first aid.
- Report problems to supervisors concerning campers and staff and use appropriate chain of command.
- Never come to camp while under the influence of any drugs or alcohol.
- Attend every day of camp on the week(s) accepted, unless I become ill.

The following dress code is enforced to ensure LITs are proper role models while fostering a positive self-image. LITs failing to come to camp properly dressed will be asked to leave the site or find alternative attire.

1. Shirts may not be low necked or loose necked.

- 2. You must wear closed toed shoes; no sandals or flip flops.
- 3. Shorts may be worn as long as they are of appropriate length.
- 4. No Lycra or Spandex clothing.
- 5. For safety reasons, dangling jewelry (hoops, etc.) is prohibited.
- 6. Swimsuits for women should be one piece or tankinis.
- 7. Shorts, hats, etc. shall not have pictures or words implying or relating to profanity, vulgarity or inappropriate situations.
- 8. LITs must come to camp clean and neatly groomed.
- 9. LITs must leave their shirt on at all times except during swimming activities.

_____Chain of command for all camp issues, from staff issued to camper issues is as follows: Counselor, Program Director, Camp Director. I have read and understand the chain of command.

Grounds for Immediate Dismissal (no refund given):

- A parent/guardian who refuses to follow Camp Alexander policies as stated in the policy handbook.
- An LIT that brings a weapon to camp.
- An LIT who intentionally harms himself/herself or causes injury to another child or staff member.
- An LIT who vandalizes the property of the camp facility, staff or other children.
- An LIT who steals items from the camp facility, staff or other children.
- An LIT who displays inappropriate behaviors repeatedly.
- An LIT who fails to comply with the rules of conduct.
- An LIT who fails to display appropriate respect to authority figures on site.
- There will be a three strike policy rule for 2022. If an LIT receives three strikes during the summer, the LIT will be relieved from his/her duties at Camp and will not be allowed to return.

We have read and understand the rules of conduct and agree to uphold them to maintain a safe end enjoyable camp experience for everyone.

If your application is accepted you will receive a notification via email of the weeks accepted and an invoice that may be paid online. A deposit of 50% is required to confirm reservation. The balance is due 3 weeks before the first day of each camp week.

PLEASE NOTE, LIT APPLICANTS MAY INITIALLY ONLY BE ACCEPTED TO 2 WEEKS MAXIMUM. If additional weeks are desired, you may stay on the Wait List for additional weeks. At the completion of two weeks, if there is availability and based on the LIT's performance, the Camp Director may allow the LIT to register for one additional week at a time.
